Scholarship Fund Criteria

Purpose: The New Jersey Hispanic Leadership Association (NJHLA) awards scholarships to Hispanic Heritage students attending college full-time, based on academic achievement, financial need, and an expressed interest in pursuing a college education.

Criteria: The students eligible for assistance must be in good academic standing and meet the following qualifications:

1. Currently attending college as a full-time student with a minimum 3.0 GPA. Must submit **Official College transcript with the raised seal.**
2. Be of Hispanic heritage.
3. Attending an accredited New Jersey University, College or Community College;
4. Provide two letters of recommendation from an educator and/or an academic advisor, from the current year and on school letterhead. Letters must be typed.
5. Submit a minimum 500 word Written Essay, typed double-spaced, in 12-point Times New Roman font, with numbered pages. Please refer to the Scholarship Fund Essay Question below. **(PDF Format Preferred)**
6. Financial Need, must have a household income of \$80,000 or less per year
7. Applicant must include their contact information: name, address, email address, and phone number. Student must submit a copy of an official document that verifies their residency in the State of New Jersey
8. Applicant must submit a professional photo to be posted with their name on all NJ HLA Social Media platforms if the scholarship is awarded

Guidelines: Scholarships will be awarded on an annual basis to selected students who attend College full-time, and maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA. Students must submit Official Transcripts as outlined above.

Amount: The HLA will grant up to three (3) scholarship awards in the amount of \$1,500 each. Payment will be disbursed in two (2) equal installments. The first payment will be awarded at the NJHLA Annual Gala. The second payment will be awarded in January, two weeks after the fall semester ends, and the Official transcript has been submitted and confirmed as received by a Committee Board Member.

Deadline: August 2, 2024. Please submit complete application packet online to: NJHLA.Scholarships@gmail.com, with the subject line **NJHLA Scholarship Committee**. Student(s) will be notified via email. **Late applications, and incomplete packets, will not be considered.**

Renewal Amount/Distribution: The NJHLA Scholarship is not renewable. Previous scholarship recipients, of partial or full awards, are not eligible to re-apply.

Review and Selection Process: The Scholarship Committee will review all applications and make recommendations to the NJHLA Board of Directors.

Award Announcement: Scholarship finalists will be contacted by Wednesday, September 4, 2024, and interviewed by the Selection Committee. **Note:** *To remain eligible, the award recipient will be required to attend the New Jersey Hispanic Leadership Association Awards Gala in **October 19, 2024**, after verbal acceptance of the award.*

Scholarship Fund Essay Question

Minimum of 500 Words

Describe how you have demonstrated leadership abilities in the Hispanic community both in and out of school.

Student Organizations: Participating in or leading Hispanic student organizations within your school can be a great way to demonstrate leadership. This could involve organizing events, advocating for issues important to the Hispanic community, and fostering a sense of unity among students.
